

HERE IS WHAT WE LEARNED ...

1.	<u>What is your primary reason for writing a book?</u>	Upon review of the results, surprisingly, incarcerated writers reported reasons for writing as things like; to honor God, for family, creative or therapeutic reasons, and to help others.
2.	How Did You Hear About Authors Inside?	Most participants reported hearing about Authors Inside from the book, <i>The Sentences that Create Us</i> , and we are truly grateful to Pen America for including our publishing program as a resource.
3.	What Is Your Book Genre?	The most popular manuscripts that we receive are self-help, memoirs, and poetry books.
4.	<u>What Is the Core Message of</u> <u>Your Book?</u>	Consistently, the theme of book projects we receive center around giving back, encouragement, and helping others. Restoring the community is another common theme.
5.	Do You Currently Participate in Any Writing Programs?	Another surprise finding, each respondent said they would like to participate in a writing program but there were none offered outside of GED courses.
6.	<u>What Kind of Writing Support</u> <u>Would You Need?</u>	Things like mentorship, writing workbooks and publishing services ranked high in the desire for additional support.

The Educational Services branch of Authors Inside is proud to announce that behavior-specific curriculums can be produced for inhome self-study in addition to creation and publication for county probation, juvenile halls, county jails, prisons, transitional homes, state parole, and by criminal justice students based on their respective need.

I AM" and how you can change and make a greater impact by changing lives through a collaborated effort with the men and women behind Authors Inside.

Teaching "I O.W.N. I AM"

It was with great honor and encouragement that I found myself responsible for the Educational Services of Authors Inside's selfimposed task to create Hope, Healing, and Reform to Reduce Recidivism. Because of the publication of the interactive workbook which I co-authored (as Otis Greene III) with the formerly infamous George K.L. Smith, I was able to teach others by utilizing his life and mine, how to grasp the origin of their dysfunction and utilize it as an opportunity to change, how to change, what that change should look like, and how to prevent a return to a place of negativity.

I have had the privilege of executing this task in several prisons within the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation as well as inpatient and outpatient treatment facilities in California (and one time in Minnesota). The fact that I have been able to use the "crud" (George uses that word) of my life and his to encourage others to live a healthy lifestyle and safeguard the lives of others has been a blessing bestowed upon me that I will forever be grateful for.

PROGRAMMING RESOURCES

Each Saturday, since February 5th, 2022, Authors Inside's Programming Resources Director, George K. L. Smith, has provided the youth of the Juvenile Justice Center in Alameda County an opportunity to explore and highlight their personal successes through narrative writing, despite their current state of physical incarceration.

By providing the youth with a platform to challenge their own perceptions, beliefs, and values, we have begun to witness a beautiful transformation of the necessary correcting of existing mistaken beliefs.

The youth are engaged in Anger Management, Character Defect Management, Denial Management, Time Management and prevention techniques and strategies derived from the G.R.O.W. programs very own, A New View curriculum. There are youth who are currently writing their own books and anthologies to become published authors.

Writing & Book Publishing

At the heart and soul of the work we do is a traumainformed writing program. Authors Inside's hope is to create a pathway for at-risk youth, teens and young adults entering the judicial system, as well as adult offenders, to make sustainable change through narrative and creative writing. We believe writing is therapeutic and can be expressed in many forms.

The authors who partner with us to accomplish their writing goals have published in genres from poetry, memoirs, children's books, and self-help. For writers who need additional support, we offer a 3-book resource set as a guide (see images on the left).

- To date, Authors Inside has published 12 books written by incarcerated authors
- It costs us approximately \$2,500 (below market cost) to complete a project (includes line editing, proofreading, interior formatting, illustrations, and graphic designs)
- Currently, we have 4 book projects awaiting publication, and 10 new manuscripts awaiting a publishing contract, all of which we feel advance our mission and vision statement
- Due to low funds, we have reached a point where community donations are needed to help us continue offering our writing and publishing program
- Your donation will help us continue to provide writing resources, support, and book publishing to incarcerated authors. These books have a valuable message that provides healing and hope for the offender, victims, and the community
